The United States began with the Declaration of Independence – freedom.

The Bible is a story about freedom - human beings made in the image of the most free being of all, Almighty God.

Freedom rightly used comes to life with even more freedom and life. Freedom wrongly used enslaves and kills.

In Hosea's story we see how human freedom gets hijacked by sin and how God sets in motion His plan of redemption to restore freedom and set right what sin makes wrong.

In the New Testament, God comes in Christ Jesus to deliver His people into spiritual freedom and establish the kingdom of heaven.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me (Jesus)... to proclaim freedom for the prisoners, to release the oppressed...to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

"The truth will set you free." JOHN 8:32

"Where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty." 2 CORINTHIANS 3:17

"It is for freedom Christ has set us free." GALATIANS 5:1

How was freedom abused?

- Self-righteous hypocrisy and legalism
- Self-indulgent lust and license

"I have seen a horrible thing in Israel: there Ephraim is giving to prostitution, Israel is defiled." HOSEA 6:10



Throwing away rules and guidelines doesn't bring freedom. Licentiousness is a trap into another kind of slavery – addiction.

When you take the bait, that which looks like the real thing, moves like the real thing, promises to satisfy like the real thing... **it isn't real**. It bites back trying to consume you and take you captive.

God loves us, but some of our choices are hurting and killing us.

Bad ideas will cloud your thinking and control your mind. Bad habits can stifle your life and deaden your relationship with God.

How can you know you're using freedom right? It brings more freedom and life. How can you tell you're not? You reap captivity and death.

Laws of Harvest:

- You reap what you sow: good choices or bad choices.
- You reap later than you sow: some choices take time to mature.
- You reap more than you sow: the consequences are greater.



Spiritual freedom through Christ brings freedom from guilt and the penalty of sin and freedom from captivity and slavery to sin.

With God: Invite God to fire up your heart with love by faith. Find your identity in God's salvation family.

With Others: Invest seeds of daily faithfulness in your relationships that will bring you into a life harvest of fruitfulness in your marriage, family and friendships.

With Church: Invoke God's resources with your spiritual family. Come to church, get in a group, take steps toward freedom and get unstuck.

Why does freedom exist? So we can do the will of God and grow to our full redemptive potential as divine image bearers in Christ.

We use freedom to move into more freedom by staying in step with God.
