Harvard Medical School: Health Advantages of Marriage (2016)

- Live longer
- Fewer heart attacks and strokes
- Lower chance of depression
- Survive major operations
- Less likely to have advanced cancer at time of diagnosis and longer post-cancer survival

"Those who rated their marriage as 'very happy' or 'pretty happy' had 20% lower odds of dying early than people who said their marriages were 'not too happy'." – Time Magazine report (2018) from Health Psychology
