"Our God is a God who saves." PSALM 68:20

"I am the Lord, and besides me there is no Savior." ISAIAH 43:11

"Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners."

1 TIMOTHY 1:15

"This is good and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth."

"The Lord...is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance..."

What does it mean to be "saved"?

Saved = become roomy, broad, spacious. In contrast to being confined, constricted, and oppressed.

Deliverance comes to the rescue and moves us out into God's 'wide open spaces'.

Salvation is a person you know (Jesus), not a transaction you make. It's not just a point of decision; it's a process of development. It's not just a status; it's a journey.

Our Savior is the Living God and the salvation he gives is alive.

It's a thing of the past, of the present and of the future all at the same time.
