We all long to belong:

- we want to be known
- we want to be loved
- we want to be part of helping our world

We want to be known for who we truly are. One way the Bible's story shows us that is in the names people are given.

- Jacob: one who overreaches
- Israel: one who triumphantly wrestles with God

Mary and Joseph were told - "You are to give him the name Jesus for he will save his people from their sins."

Buddy wanted to love and be loved by his real dad. We do, too.

"Even the very hairs on your head are numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

Matthew 10:30

"God **so** loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son..."

Buddy got thrown out by his dad; even told in another scene that he wanted him out of his life.

Counselors who work with men call this the 'father wound', which is an emotional injury that comes through the emotional and verbal absence or abuse of a father.
