NOTES

Rahab is one of two women mentioned in Faith's Hall of Fame - Hebrews 11.

"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Hebrews 11:1

Rahab is part of the genealogy of King David, which makes her an ancestor to Jesus.

"Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab, Boaz the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth, Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of King David." Matthew 1:5-6a

"... And Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah." Matthew 1:16

Rahab was a Canaanite from the ancient city of Jericho, the area we know today as the West Bank.

Due to her bad habits (a liar, a prostitute), her home was part of the city wall away from respectable residents.



Why does God honor her memory in such a significant way?

Rahab hid the Israelite spies from the king under stalks of flax on her rooftop.

"Before the spies lay down for the night, she went up on the roof and said to them, 'I know that the Lord has given this land to you and that great fear of you has fallen on us, so that all who live in this country are melting in fear because of you. We have heard how the Lord dried up the water in the Red Sea for you when you came out of Egypt and what you did to Sihon and Og, the two kings of the Amorites east of the Jordan, whom you completely destroyed." Joshua 2:8-10

"The iniquity of the Amorites was not yet full." Genesis 15:16

God gave the people of Canaan over 420 years to change their wicked, cruel and destructive ways and turn to him. They didn't.



"When we heard of it our hearts melted and everyone's courage failed because of you, for the Lord your God is God in heaven above and on the earth below." Joshua 2:11

Critics say "the God of the Bible is a bully, a savage, cruel, a barbaric myth."
